Update to the Richlawn Beautification Ordinance

Just in time for Spring planting and yard work, the Richlawn council has amended our Beautification Ordinance (AKA Tree Program). Our city will now reimburse 100% of the cost of planting, pruning or removal of a canopy tree up to \$500 per residence per year. Canopy trees include: Sugar Maple, all Oak, all Cyprus, Ginkgo and Black Gum.

So, as the weather gets warmer, consider planting a tree to help sustain our canopy for future generations. *Please contact Commissioner Andrew Renda with any questions.*

Upcoming Events:

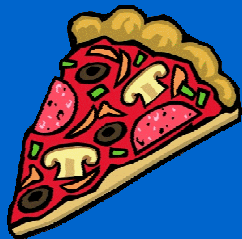
-Easter Egg Hunt in Lang Field March 28th at 4:00.

Yard Waste Collection Program



All yard waste is collected separately from residential waste. The new rules (as of May 2014) state that yard waste should be prepared in one of the following ways:

-30-35 gallon can dedicated to ONLY yard waste and clearly labeled "YARD WASTE"

-30-35 gallon PAPER yard waste bag

-Bundles of sticks should not exceed 4 feet in length or 75 pounds

-Compostable plastic bags (meeting ASTM D6400 standards)

-Rumpke issued 96 gallon yard waste cart

(\$3 fee per month charged by Rumpke upon ordering-call 568-3800)

Yard waste (grass, weeds, shrubbery, plant clippings, twigs, leaves, logs, or dirt) will be collected from April 6, 2015-December 28, 2015 at the curb. Please be sure to have your yard waste in appropriate containers to avoid a fine.
